
CARE OF THE SICK

Our Challenge

Dear friends.

However self-sufficient we might wish to be, ultimately our lives are in God's hands. Whether we wither or bloom ultimately lies beyond our control. We have a responsibility to grow and bear fruit. But when we have done our best to live a committed and productive life, the rest is in God's hands. In this weekend's second reading, St. Paul is still addressing the earliest Christian Church in Corinth, Greece. His obvious confidence was in no other than God, and it knew no boundaries. Paul was willing to take whatever happened in stride because he knew that God was on

his side. Whether he lived or died, he knew that his life and his ultimate destiny were in God's hands. In other times and places, when people lived closer to the soil, they knew that life was ultimately beyond their control. When they had tilled the ground and planted the seed, they knew the results were out of their hands. They knew that life in this world was dependent on the goodness and grace of God, and on their faithfulness to God. Biblically, and especially in Old Testament times, 'covenant' refers to the relationship we have with God through faith. It involves commitments, and it in some ways is similar to marriage. A covenant is a contract in which there are responsibilities on both sides. A covenant is a relationship in which each partner contributes and from which each partner benefits. Biblical faith is a matter of both trusting in God and working for God. We betray our faith when we neglect either one. We need to strike a balance between doing our part and leaving the rest to God. Well-known guotations gain that status by being true to life in this world. A long-forgotten preacher is credited by many to have said: "Work as if everything depends on you. Trust as if everything depends on God." Our relationship with God is not a 50-50 division of labor. We owe our best to God, to our faith, and to a world in need of redemption. We have already been given everything we need to fulfill our lives in accordance to God's will.


