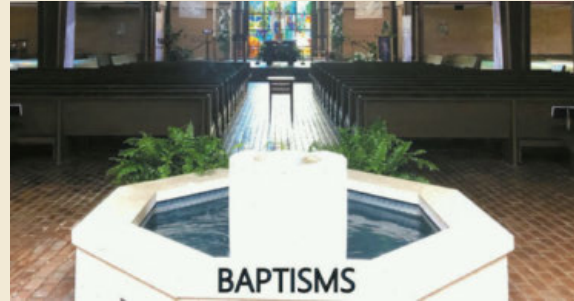

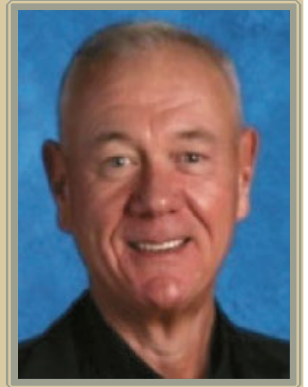

Our Challenge

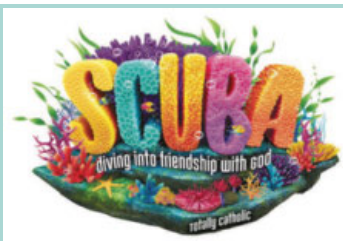
Dear friends:

The Acts of the Apostles tells us that the resurrected Christ spent forty days with his disciples, teaching them all the things they would need to know to carry on his work. When his work on this earth was done, he was caught up in a cloud that took him out of sight but certainly not out of mind or heart. He continued to be with his followers in spirit. Those early Christians were convinced that the power of God was demonstrated in his raising Jesus from the dead and elevating him to his own right hand in heaven. The resurrection of Jesus would have been incomplete without his ascension to heavenly glory where he was made the head of the church and the ruler of the world. In his account of the Ascension in the last verses of his gospel, Mark says that before he ascended to heaven, the resurrected Jesus appeared to his eleven disciples as they sat at table. He commissioned them to go out into the whole world and preach the Good News. He assured them that evidence of true believers would be their good works and resilience against evil. There is a wisdom in the passing of the generations. It's the same wisdom we witness in the natural order when the mother bird kicks the baby birds out of nest so that they learn to fly and fend for themselves. It's the same wisdom parents exercise by teaching their children to take responsibility for their actions and behavior by not getting them out of every mess into which they get themselves. It's the same wisdom pastors exercise by exhorting their parishioners to become equipped to exercise pastoral ministry in their communities instead of depending on him to "do it all." If the older generation did not pass on, the younger generation could never take responsibility for themselves and ownership of the world. That's why Jesus left this world and ascended into heaven. He wanted his followers to take responsibility for the mission and message of the church. When Christ left this world, he put his mission and message in our hands. There is an old poem that captures this sense of responsibility in a memorable way: *"Christ has no hands but our hands to do his work today; He has no feet but our feet to lead men in his way; He has no tongue but our tongue to tell men why he died; He has no help but our help to draw men to his side."*

- The Holy Eucharist will go on a pilgrimage through 4 routes crisscrossing the United States; the Eucharist will come to St. Joseph's Cathedral in Baton Rouge; the 4 routes will culminate at the National Eucharistic Congress

The 10th National Eucharistic Congress: July 17 - 21, 2024

- Join us in Indianapolis for a life-changing encounter with Jesus as we return to the Source and Summit of our faith.

The Fête-Dieu du Mississippi: August 14 - 15, 2024

- The Host will travel down the Mississippi in an 80' tall Monstrance from Baton Rouge to New Orleans

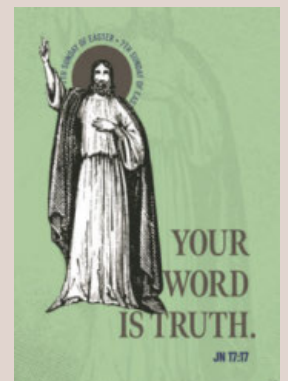

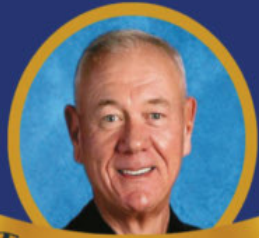


