
A PRAYER FOR Hurricane Season

Dear friends,

Words cannot do justice to the gratitude I have and feel...for all who worked so hard and long to help me celebrate my 42nd Anniversary of Ordination to the priesthood and retirement from active ministry on June 30. I had been so pre-occupied with my pre-retirement 'to do' list that I was totally unaware of all the individuals who were so generously of their time, talents, and resources *'pulling out all the stops'* to make it such a



memorable, spectacular, magnificent, and glorious event for me. I'll still be processing it weeks from now!

I am in awe of the way that God, in his providence, equipped me...amidst all my human frailties and faults...to be an instrument of communicating the affection, love, and care of his Son to

so many over the years....I had no idea. While I have 'jokingly' stated that I'm continuing...even as I retire...to discern my vocation to the priesthood, all that you did for me continues to affirm that I spent my life doing the right thing. I will try, to the best of my abilities, to continue to do that in retirement. As I implicated in what I said on Sunday (June 30)....one never 'retires' from the sacrament of Holy Orders.

My message to everybody is 'be true to who you are,' even if in the perception of others it betrays your reputation and record of achievements. When one finger points at you, there are three fingers pointing back, and that will eventually catch up with the 'finger pointers. So, pray for them and love them as I do. I believe that because I don't pass judgment on them, God will not pass judgment on me. I mentioned in my remarks at the end of my Anniversary Mass on Sunday, June 30th, that one of my 'mantras,' since it appeared on the prayer card at my ordination 42 years ago is the 'prayer for priests' composed by Fr. Karl Rahner, S.J. Another more *secular* 'mantra' of mine is the lyrics of Bob Dylan's song, *Forever Young*, which itself is a prayer, and my wish for you!

The incoming 7th pastor of St. Aloysius Parish is 24 years younger than me, full of excitement, enthusiasm, energy, dynamism, leadership and pastoral ministry skills that will serve him...and you...very well to assure that the vibrancy of our parish family just continues to thrive for years to come!

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Once I asked a fallen-away Catholic friend of mine what he remembered about the parish priest from his youth. He said, "He was a gentle, nice guy. Kind of vanilla. Kept to himself." It struck me that he, perhaps like many, perceive Catholic priests as the following: lonely, harmless, and self-sufficient. As a challenge both to this perception (accurate or not) and to us priests who perhaps feel a pull in that uninspiring direction, stands the mighty image of what we see in the Gospel this Sunday.

Jesus sent out his apostles, "**two-by-two, with power over demons, and without money belts**." **Two-by-two**: they enjoyed deep fellowship and brotherhood. **Power over demons**: they were anything but harmless. These men wielded enormous power against evil. **Without money belts**: they were not self-sufficient. They needed others to help them. Not lonely, but in community. Not harmless but armed with massive spiritual energy. Not self-sufficient, but poor and in need of help.

This is a challenge to me, and perhaps to all of us, living in a rich, secularized, and individualized culture. Do I embrace my priestly ministry in deep fellowship with other priests? Do I speak and act boldly to drive out evil where it is found? Do I live poorly and simply, trusting in the help of those around me even for basic needs? The fruitfulness of priestly ministry largely depends on these three traits. Let's pray for all priests — and, by extension, all of us Christians — to live more like Jesus' communal, poor, and powerful apostles.



What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.


