




Families of the sick are encouraged to contact the Pastoral Services Center at 343-6657. Communion is brought to the sick weekly. Hospital visits are also made weekly.





"I Thirst" — John 7:37

May we all seek to grow in prayer, allowing Jesus to quench our thirst as we also answer His call to come to Him.



Christmas Flower Memorial


During Advent, Altar Flowers usually do not decorate the church or sanctuary. The church is decorated gradually throughout the season of Advent until it is fully


