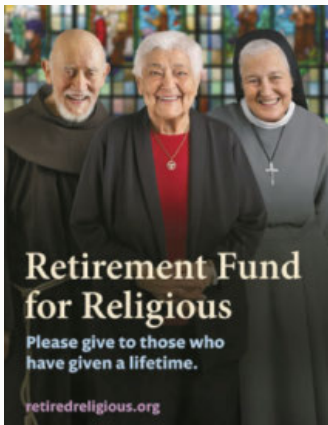
Christmas Flower Memorial






