

### Come experience a deeper prayer life this Advent season

The Catechism, citing St. Therese of Lisieux, defines prayer as "a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven; it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." (CCC 2558) While St. Therese of Lisieux's straightforward definition is appealing, St. Paul in his letter to the Romans points out that "...we do not know how to pray as we ought." (Romans 8:26) The simple fact is that prayer can be intimidating. But it need not be overwhelming.

The St. Aloysius Stewardship through Prayer Committee invites parishioners to a deeper prayer life this Advent season. Routine and consistent prayer is essential to hear God's voice in our lives. Prayer can take many forms. Whether it be through daily or Sunday Mass attendance, offering memorized prayers, spending time in adoration, silently reading and discerning the messages of scripture, or quietly and humbly bringing our needs before the Lord, an intentional practice of prayer is a cornerstone of a healthy Christian spiritual life. In short, like all relationships, our relationship with Jesus requires ongoing and consistent communication. It is only with consistent prayer that we can see what God is doing in us

and through us, and what more He wants to do through us.

"See, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? In the wilderness I make a way, in the wasteland, rivers." — Isaiah 43:19

And while prayer can be intimidating, the good news is that St. Paul's message to the Romans does not end with acknowledging that "we do not know how to pray as we ought." The verse goes on to say "we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the one who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because it intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will." (Romans 8:26 - 27)

In short, when we humbly seek God's companionship, friendship and guidance through prayer, we are best able to see how to live the life He calls us towards. We do not need to pray perfectly. Showing up — vulnerably, honestly, and quietly with God — is more than half the battle. And rooted in prayer we are best able to participate in His divine plan of renewing our lives and world.



## St. Aloysius School Celebrates All Saints

St. Aloysius School recently celebrated the Feast of All Saints, the Commemoration of All Souls and the traditions of All Hallows' Eve. In all religion classes, students participated in classroom lessons regarding these teachings. In addition, the school participated in many special celebrations of these sacred days.

First-graders completed a service project to aid Consortium 31, an organization that brings joy to underprivileged children by hosting Halloween celebrations. The first-graders collected and donated candy. They also decorated bags with Halloween characters and sayings.

On Friday, Oct. 29, the entire school participated in trick-or-treating. Students in seventh and eighth grades handed out candy to the students in the lower grades. The fourth-graders also had a retreat on this day. The theme of the retreat was "All Saints' Day." Fourth-graders learned more about the apostles through a series of activities titled "Fishers of Men." They also learned about the saints depicted in the icons in the church in a discussion titled "The Communion of Saints." The students learned about the process of canonization and the church teachings regarding Purgatory and All Souls' Day. They created icons of loved ones who have died and gone to Heaven. These icons were displayed at the concluding prayer service of the retreat.

On Wednesday, Nov. 3, kindergarten through eighth-grade students gathered for our first in-person All School Mass in

18 months. It was a joyous celebration facilitated by the sixth-grade Liturgical Choir and cantors and the sixth-grade computer enrichment group. The students and parents collaborated to create a "Book of Life" containing the names of special loved ones for whom we prayed. Banners of fourth-grade icons were hung at the front of the church. Students and faculty were excited to celebrate our school community ties and our ties to the Communion of Saints in Heaven. As with every All School Mass, food was collected for the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank. Students were asked to bring special items to help clients celebrate Thanksgiving with their families. The total for this collection was 640 pounds, which equates to 533 meals.

Our celebration of All Saints continued through Friday, with the first-graders dressing as saints and presenting their reports about the saints. COVID protocols allowed for parents to be present to hear their children's reports. Parents reported to the classrooms in groups of five, wearing masks. The students were excited to share their newfound knowledge with classmates and parents.

Throughout November, we continued to commemorate the saints. In the classroom, students prayed for the souls in Purgatory. In the school office, the "Book of Life" remained on display. The fourthgrade banners were also displayed in the school office, reminding us of our loved ones who may be gone but who are definitely not forgotten.




#### Veterans honored through education, letters of appreciation

On Thursday, Nov. 11, we paused to honor all who have fought to keep our country free. The eighth-grade students at St. Aloysius School showed their appreciation by writing letters to relatives and friends thanking them for their service.

On Nov. 10, Pat Veazey and Betty Langlinais, members of the Daughters of The American Revolution Baton Rouge Canary Islands Chapter, visited the students. DAR is an organization of women whose heritage can be proven to have participated in the American Revolution. Any woman 18 or older who can meet the heritage proof guidelines is eligible to join. The DAR motto is "God, Home and Country," and its mission is to promote historic preservation, education and patriotism. Close to a million women have joined the Daughters of the American Revolution since it was founded. Mrs. Veazey, organizing chapter regent, and Mrs. Langlinais, organizing member, talked to the students about the history of Veterans Day, as well as the history behind The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington, Va., which marked its  $100^{\rm th}$  anniversary this year. The students learned how the soldier buried in the tomb was selected. Mrs. Veazey discussed the rigorous training volunteers from the Army must go through to guard the tomb. Each sentinel must be able to flawlessly perform seven different types of walks, honors and ceremonies. They must retain vast amounts of knowledge concerning the tomb, Arlington National Cemetery, the United States Army and their unit.

Pat Veazey and Betty Langlinais are no strangers to our school, they are both retired teachers from St. Aloysius.




The Child Care Center was also able to host its first in-person family event in over a year! The annual Fall Fest was held on Oct. 29. Children and families enjoyed fun and fellowship with pizza, chicken fingers and sweet treats at this picnic-style event.

In continuing the Thanksgiving and fall fun, each class decorated a Thanksgiving-themed pumpkin that was displayed in the child care center lobby throughout the month. If you saw the pumpkins, you might've

also noticed the SACCC turkey, who made her return as children brought in feathers representing their families and gifts for which they are thankful.

Lastly, the SACCC adopted more families again this year for the Thanksgiving Baskets Ministry. Ten families from the church parish received turkey trimmings and items needed to provide their families with Thanksgiving meals. This was made possible thanks to donations from SACCC families.





## Admission Policy and Criteria

St. Aloysius School admits all qualified students regardless of race, ethnicity, sex, or national origin. St. Aloysius School complies with Diocesan Guidelines for admission of students as stated in the Handbook of Policies for the Schools of the Diocese of Baton Rouge. All students presently enrolled at St. Aloysius School in Pre-K through seventh grade will be given first priority for admission for the next school year. Due to the possibility of limited space, newly entering students will be accepted to St. Aloysius School according to the following criteria:

#### Criteria for Acceptance

\*Note that an "active" St. Aloysius parishioner is defined as one identifiably participating in all phases of Church parish stewardship: Prayer, Offering, and Ministry. Minimally, "Stewardship of Prayer" means regularly being part of the worshipping faith community at Sunday and Holy Day Masses. "Stewardship of Offering" means regularly, consistently, and identifiably contributing to Sunday church support and/or building fund collections through the use of stewardship envelopes, automatic bank draft, or bank-by-mail, according to financial ability. "Stewardship of Ministry" means active and identifiable involvement in a Church parish ministry of service.

Students are accepted to St. Aloysius School based on space availability and the following prioritized criteria for Pre-K through 8th Grade:

- 1. Children (baptized Catholics) whose parents are registered active parishioners\* of St. Aloysius Church, living within the territorial boundaries of St. Aloysius Parish, with children presently enrolled. Children of employees of St. Aloysius Parish, School, or Child Care Center.
- 2. Children (baptized Catholics) whose parents are registered active parishioners\* of St. Aloysius Church, living outside the territorial boundaries of St. Aloysius Parish, with children presently enrolled.
- 3. Children (baptized Catholics) whose parents are registered active parishioners\* of St. Aloysius Church, living within the territorial boundaries of St. Aloysius Parish, with no children presently enrolled.
- 4. Children (baptized Catholics) whose parents are registered active parishioners\* of St. Aloysius Church, living outside the territorial boundaries of St. Aloysius Parish, with no children presently enrolled.
- 5. Children (baptized Catholics) whose parents are registered but are not active parishioners\* of St. Aloysius Church. (Follows the order above 1-4.)
- 6. Children (baptized Catholics) from out-of-parish Catholic families with siblings presently enrolled in St. Aloysius School.
- 7. Children (baptized Catholics) from out-of-parish Catholic families with no siblings presently enrolled in St. Aloysius
- 8. Children of non-Catholic families, who allow their children to participate in the school's religion program.
- \*\*If all criteria are met equally and there is limited space, the child applying from the St. Aloysius Child Care Center will be given priority. The St. Aloysius School Pre-K Program was created to bridge the gap between pre-school and kindergarten for our parishioners involved in this ministry, and we will honor that commitment.

#### Entrance Requirements

- 1. A child must be four years old on or before September 30 of the year entering preschool.
- 2. A child must be five years old on or before September 30 of the year entering kindergarten.
- 3. A child must be six years old on or before September 30 of the year entering first grade.

#### Pre-K & Kindergarten Entrance Requirements

Pre-K: Child must be four years old on or before September 30 of the year entering Pre-K. The school reserves the right to contact and obtain a recommendation from the child's previous caregiver/childcare center. Possible pre-screening will take place based on recommendation from previous childcare and/or based on child's age. This is to ensure proper placement for your child and to reduce the possibility of retention.

Note that in an effort to meet the needs of our growing parish families, the St. Aloysius Child Care Center will offer a 4-year old program for children who are ready for the academics of Pre-K but need the gift of time and a smaller setting. This is also an option for those parents needing full-day care as well as a year-round option. Placement into either the School's Pre-K or K following the Child Care Center's 4-year old program will be a joint determination between St. Aloysius Child Care Center and St. Aloysius School, to ensure success of the child.

K: Child must be five years old on or before September 30 of the year entering Kindergarten. The school reserves the right to contact and obtain a recommendation from the child's previous child care center. Possible pre-screening will take place based on recommendation from previous child care and/or based on child's age. This is to ensure proper placement for your child and to reduce the possibility of retention.


